



In November 2013, the Berlin 11 Satellite Conference for Students and Early Stage Researchers demonstrated the demand for a conference on Open Access and related issues targeting the next generation of scholars and researchers. Co-hosted by the Max Planck Society and the Right to Research Coalition, SPARC's student initiative, the meeting convened more than seventy participants, (selected from a pool of three hundred applicants) representing thirty-five nationalities across five continents. More than a dozen leaders from the Open Access community also attended the conference, and affirmed the conference's utility in encouraging the next generation of scholars to take ownership of the system of scholarly communication that they will inherit.

Slated to take place in Washington D.C. in late Fall of 2014 (targeting November 15-17 to coordinate with the international Open Education Conference), this year's meeting will be expanded significantly in size, scope, and duration. Held over three days, the meeting is designed to serve as a powerful catalyst for projects led by the next generation of scholars and researchers to advance Open Access, Open Data, and Open Educational Resources. The first two days will combine a formal program of keynotes and panel discussions with interactive workshops to build participants' skills in key areas, from raising institutional awareness to coordinating national-level campaigns effectively. The third day will take advantage of the meeting's Washington D.C. location by providing a half-day of advocacy training followed by the opportunity for in-person meetings with policymakers ranging from members of the U.S. Congress to representatives from national embassies and IGOs.

Most importantly, the meeting will serve as a strong centerpiece for a larger international students and early stage researchers action network that will provide a framework to support the work of students throughout

the year. Travel scholarships will provide a strong incentive for individuals to get involved before applications open, and encourage continued involvement in preparation for the next year's meeting. For those who cannot attend in person, the meeting will be live-streamed, and options for organizing satellite events around the world that re-create the energy of the in-person meeting will be explored

Most students and early career researchers, even those at well-funded institutions, simply do not have access to travel funding for a meeting such as this.
